We believe in the importance of providing quality treatment care for both our children and foster families. We welcome the opportunity to include your family within our larger 'UMCH family'. UMCH originated in 1911. Our foster parent program began in 1993. This program has grown to 50 foster families primarily through positive 'word of mouth' by our current foster parents. UMCH provides internal ongoing professional trainings for our foster parents. We enjoy seasonal foster family outings and honor our foster families during our annual May Foster Parent event.

UMCH provides seasoned, strong case managers and clinicians to assist both foster children and your family with day-to-day challenges and treatment needs. UMCH case managers provide needed school support to children and will attend MFE and IEP educational meetings with your family. UMCH case managers attend county SARs and court hearings for all of our children. UMCH clinicians believe in the importance of family centered therapy and will include your input and biological family input to more thoroughly address child and family issues. UMCH also provides on site psychological and psychiatric services. UMCH provides on call support around the clock.

Our agency has a full continuum of care, thus boys often step-down from our residential programming to our treatment foster homes. If foster boys age 11 and up are in need of a more structured environment, we are also able to move these children for short-term stabilization to our residential program. It is also our goal to help children successfully transition to their biological families through services provided by our Wesley Family Services Outpatient and Aftercare programming.
